NOTE FROM THE CARTOGRAPHER

The maps are traced from the 12½ inches to the mile Ordnance Survey of 1934, which was revised by BKS Air Survey Ltd in 1958.

The draughtsman's guiding principles have been: to emphasise place names; to bring up in blue all water; to liberate Ordnance Survey sheets from the symbols for woodland, substituting a plain green ground on which words and numbers stand out clearly.
